When do we do it?



As part of your PSHE lessons. This will be once a week in the same afternoon slot. Your teacher will usually do your PSHE lessons.

How is my learning planned?

You will have a class jigsaw piece with its own name and a PSHE learning journal to do all your work in.



My teacher will use circle time, assemblies, special projects, role play, videos, child-friendly pictures, worksheets and external visitors to help me learn.

How will I know I'm doing well?



My teacher will mark my yellow PSHE journal. They will also tell me how I'm doing in the lesson and help me to improve my work. I will also assess my learning each lesson using the colouring self-assessment sheet.

What if I have any questions?



In the lesson, your teacher may answer any questions you have after the lesson so they have time to give you the right information. In PSHE we do not ask our friends or teachers personal questions, and they will not ask us for personal information either.
