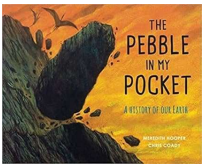
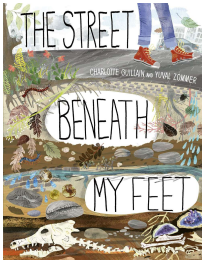
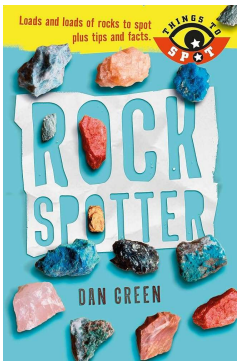




Year 3 Curriculum Map – Autumn 1 2026

What were the similarities and differences between the Stone, Bronze and Iron Age?

English	Humanities	Art and Design Technology
In Writing, we will begin by creating a set of instructions based on 'How to Clean a Woolly Mammoth.' The children will use adverbs (e.g. then, next, soon) and prepositions (e.g. before, after, during, because of) while continuing to improve the legibility, consistency and fluency of their joined handwriting. We will then write a recount of our Cave Production experience, followed by a setting description inspired by 'The Stone Age Boy.' The children will also explore the use of adjectives to create greater impact in their writing. In Reading, we will be enhancing our reading skills when reading The Stone Age Boy by Satoshi Kitamura.	In History we will be exploring the following key question: What were the similarities and differences between the Stone Age, Bronze Age and the Iron Age? We will look at how homes became more advanced, how people started to improve building and defence and how farming improved across the Ages with better tools. This half term will also see us start Spanish! This is exciting as this will be the first time for many of us. We will be learning some basics such as hello and goodbye.	In Art, we will be developing our Photography, Drawing and Collage skills. Throughout this unit of work, we will also explore the work of Stephen Wiltshire. In Cooking, we will be making fruit smoothies. During these sessions, we will learn how we need to be accurate with our measurements in order to make something tasty!

   	In Maths, we will be focussing on place value. This will help us develop a better understanding of number as we move into using hundreds and thousands in calculations. In Science, we will be exploring skeletons. We will learn to name the bones in the human skeleton and describe their functions. We will also learn to identify and name bones in a range of animals and discuss whether all skeletons are the same. In Computing, we will begin to learn about connecting computers. In this unit, we will explore how a digital device works, how digital devices help us and how computers are connected.	In PSHE, we will focus on Being me in my world. In this unit of work, we will look at our achievements and goals and what it is like to face challenges. In PE, we will be looking at improving our fitness skills this half term. We will also be learning some valuable rugby skills with the PE coach.
