Children in Need

On Friday 15th November school is raising money for Children in Need. Children can wear, for a small donation, non-uniform or spotty clothes.

Medicines

School can only administer medicine prescribed by a doctor. The medicine must have a pharmacist's label with the child's name on. Medications and prescriptions will need to be up to date. Staff cannot administer medicines without 'in-date' prescriptions

Playground Rules

Please can I remind parents and carers that Leeds City Council does not allow dogs on school premises unless they are assistance dogs. Therefore, dogs are not allowed on the school playground. Recently children have stood in dog poo left on the school playground.

Also please encourage children to dismount their bicycles once they enter the school premises, the playground is very busy in the morning and accidents may happen.

Attendance

Here is a useful guide to highlight how much time could be missed over 5 years if a child's attendance is consistently lower than 95%. Evidence shows that children who have better attendance make more progress during their school careers.

Attendance %	How much time is missed each week / fortnight	How much time is missed each year	How much time is missed over 5 years
95%	1/2 day fortnightly	2 weeks	1/4 year
90%	1/2 day weekly	4 weeks	1/2 year
85%	1 1/2 day fortnightly	6 weeks	3/4 year
80%	1 day weekly	8 weeks	1 year
75%	2 1/2 days fortnightly	10 weeks	1 1/4 years
70%	1 1/2 days weekly	12 weeks	1 1/2 years
65%	3 1/2 days fortnightly	14 weeks	1 3/4 years
60%	2 days weekly	16 weeks	2 years
55%	4 1/2 days fortnightly	18 weeks	2 1/4 years
50%	2 1/2 days weekly	20 weeks	2 1/2 years

Free School Meals

Pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are automatically entitled to Universal Infant Free School Meals, regardless of their parents' income. However if you receive any of the benefits listed below, and your child is in reception, year 1 or year 2, it's still important to register for a free school meal to ensure school doesn't miss out on funding called pupil premium.

Qualifying benefits include:

- Income Support, or
- income-based Job Seeker's Allowance, or
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance, or

- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Universal Credit, if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999, or
- Child Tax Credit, if you have an annual taxable income (as assessed by H M Revenue and Customs) which does not exceed £16,190
- if your child is eligible for free school meals, they'll continue to receive them until they move to a new stage of school, such as from primary into secondary school

Please note, if you are entitled to Working Tax Credit you do not qualify for free school meals unless:

- your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2, or
- you are receiving Working Tax Credit Run-on. This is paid for 4 weeks after your employment ends or your hours reduce to under 16 hours per week.
